**Sub.—**Admissibility of daily/foreign allowance to officers/staff and members of their families when accommodated in a hotel on posting abroad—Rates of daily allowance in Tokyo.

**Sub.—**Rate of daily allowance in Tokyo.

With reference to your letter No. 4 (14)-G58/1792, dated the 5-12-1960 on the above subject, I am directed to say that President has been pleased to decide that, in partial modification of the orders contained in this Ministry's letter No. F 2 (38) EII/55 (III), dated 14th March, 1956, when a first grade officer (as defined in S.R.17) has to stay in a hotel in Tokyo while officially accompanied by his wife, the rental ceiling of hotel accommodation shall be Yens 3,500 per day.

2. Other terms and conditions for the drawal of daily allowance will remain unchanged.

**Sub.—**Regulation of officiating pay on appointment to another higher post within or outside the cadre on which a railway servant is borne.

**Sub.—**Regulation of officiating pay on appointment to another higher post within or outside the cadre on which a railway servant is borne.

Attention is invited to Railway Board's letter of even number dated 29-1-1960 wherein it has been laid down that in the case of a railway servant who while officiating in a post, is promoted to officiate in a still higher post, and if he has on the date of his promotion completed three years continuous service in the lower officiating post, the pay in the lower officiating post should be assumed as substantive pay for the purpose of fixation in the higher officiating post.
