

Serial No. 1518.—Circular No. 831-E/46-IV(Eiv), dated 27-3-1962.

Sub.—Reservation for members of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in posts filled by promotion on Railways—Classification as selection or non-selection posts consequent on revision of pay structure.

A copy of Railway Board's letter No. E(SCT)61-CM1/125, dated 22-2-1962 is reproduced below for information and guidance:—

"Reference Board's letters No. E(SCT)57CM1/20, dated 27-4-1959 and No. E(NG)61PM1/39, dated 12-9-1961 and 3-2-1962. A question has been raised as to:—

- (i) whether the existing arrear shortfalls of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in erstwhile 'selection' posts now declared as 'non-selection' posts may be treated as automatically lapsed; and
 - (ii) whether the shortfalls in the erstwhile 'non-selection' posts now declared as 'selection' posts should be calculated with retrospective effect from 4-1-1957 or from the date from which the posts have been declared as 'selection' posts.
2. The Board have decided that in (i) above, the arrear shortfalls may be treated as automatically lapsed. As regards (ii) the shortfall should be calculated from 12-9-1961."

2. The Board's letters dated 27-4-1959, 12-9-1961 and 3-2-1962 referred to therein were circulated under this office endorsements Nos. 831/46-III(Eiv), dated 16-5-1959, 831E/63/2-V(Eiv), dated 21-10-1961 and 12-3-1962.

Sub.—Recommendations of the Class IV staff Promotion Committee—Promotion from Class IV to Class III service, Typists.

Reference this office letters No. 831-E/253/2(Eiv), dated 24-7-1961 and 17-2-1962 on the above subject. The category of 'Typists' (scale Rs. 110-180 (AS)) should be added to the list of class III posts appearing in para. 4 of this office letter of even number dated 24-7-1961, for the purpose of promotion of class IV staff and class III staff in grades Rs. 55-85 (PS) 60-75 (PS) etc. to the extent of 20% vacancies in the cadre of Typists.

The class IV staff to be promoted as Typists should have a minimum speed of 40 words per minute in typewriting as for direct recruits and shall be subject to the other conditions as laid down in this office letter dated 24-7-1961 referred to above.
