Sub.—Recognition of Technical and Professional Qualifications.

A copy of the Ministry of Scientific Research and Cultural Affairs' Office Memorandum No. F.18-72/61-T2, dated 20-1-1962 received under Railway Board's letter No. E(NG)62RR1/1, dated 1-3-1962 is reproduced below for information and guidance:—

"The undersigned is directed to state that in pursuance of the general principles laid down by the Board of Assessment for Technical and Professional Qualifications, the Government of India have decided to recognise provisionally a pass in the final examination held by the State Board of Technical Education, Rajasthan for Diplomas in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering, in respect of institutions stated below, for purposes of recruitment to subordinate posts and services under the Central Government, in the appropriate fields.

1. Jodhpur Polytechnic, Jodhpur.
2. Ajmer Polytechnic, Ajmer.
3. Udaipur Polytechnic, Udaipur.
4. Kota Polytechnic, Kota.
5. Alwar Polytechnic, Alwar.'

Sub.—Treatment of period of absence of the serving Stenographers in attending the examination held by Railway Service Commissions for purposes of grant of advance increments.

A copy of Railway Board's letter No. E(G)62LE1/1, dated 15-2-1962 is reproduced below for information and guidance:—

"A question has been raised whether the examination conducted by the Railway Service Commission in connection with the grant of advance increments to serving Stenographers in the lowest grade in terms of Board's letter No. PC-60/PS-5/OS-4, dated 19-8-1960 can be considered as obligatory under Rule 305-R1 for the purpose of grant of travelling allowance etc. The Railway Board have decided that the absence of such railway employees for the days on which they take the examination plus the minimum period required for the journey to and from the examination centre may be treated as special casual leave, subject to the condition that in the case of candidates taking a third chance, no such privilege will be allowed and the period will be treated as leave due. No conveyance charges/travelling allowance/special passes will be admissible to the examinees."
