Sub.—Recognition of All India Institutes of Medical Sciences, New Delhi for the purposes of Medical Attendance and treatment of Railway employees and their families.

A copy of Railway Board's letter No. 61/M&H/1/71, dated 16-2-1962 is reproduced below for information and guidance :—

"The Railway Board have decided that the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi may be treated as a recognised Institution for the purpose of medical attendance and treatment of Railway employees and their families, till the time the laboratories and diagnostic facilities provided in the Railway hospitals are fully established.

The above has the sanction of the President."

Sub.—Grant of special pay to Railway School Teachers for performing the duties of Librarian in addition to their normal duties—
Review of—

A copy of Railway Board's letter No. PC-61/SP-1/AD/3, dated 16-1-1962 alongwith their letter No. E49SC2/3/3, dated 15-12-1949 referred to therein, is sent herewith for information and necessary action. The payment of special pay will continue to be made to only such of the teachers as are already in receipt of special pay, provided the conditions laid down by the Railway Board for grant of special pay are satisfied.

Sub.—Grant of special pay to Railway School Teachers for performing the duties of Librarian in addition to their normal duties—
Review of—

The Jagannadha Das Pay Commission vide para. 8, Chapter XXXII of their Report (1957—59) have observed that there should be periodical reviews of special pays. Accordingly, the Railway Board have since reviewed the special pay granted to Railway School Teachers working as Librarians in addition to their normal duties vide Railway Board's letter No. E49SC2/3/3, dated 15-12-1949 and have decided, with the approval of the President, that it should continue to be paid at the existing rates and conditions.

Copy of Railway Board's letter No. E49SC2/3/3, dated 15-12-1949 to the all Indian Government Railways except E.P. Railway, etc.

Sub.—Library Allowance in Railway Schools.

Reference your reply to Railway Board's letter No. E49SC2/3/3, dated 10-3-1949. The Board have had under consideration the question of grant of additional remuneration to teachers in railway schools who look after school libraries. They have decided that in the case of M.E. Schools, libraries are not an

essential requirement and that no remuneration is therefore called for. As regards H.E. Schools, where (i) the number of students in the school above the middle school classes is in excess of 100, the teacher doing the work of librarian in addition to his normal duties should be granted a special pay of Rs. 15/- p.m. for so long as he shoulders the additional responsibilities and

(ii) where the number of such students is 100 and below, the rate of special pay should be Rs. 10/- p.m.

2. The special pay referred to in (i) and (ii) above, will be payable where there is a properly organised library and provided the administration is satisfied that the work involves additional hours of duty outside normal school hours.

3. The above has the sanction of the Governor General.

Sub.—Principles and procedure for retaining gazetted and non-gazetted Railway staff in service beyond the age of superannuation.

A copy of Railway Board's letter No. E(G)61EM2-3, dated 5/6-3-1962 is reproduced below for information:—

"Reference Board's letter No. E(G)61EM2-3Pt., dated 5-8-1961 wherein the powers to grant extension of service to Gazetted Officers upto and including Senior Scale rank, for a period of one year were delegated to the General Managers of the Indian Railways. The Board have decided that, before granting extension of service to Gazetted Officers (Class I and Class II) the F.A. & C.A.O.'s concurrence should invariably be obtained.

Sub.—Determination of seniority of non-gazetted staff—Direct recruits vis-a-vis departmental promotees.

A question has been raised as to the date from which the orders communicated in this office letter of even number dated 11-12-1961 will take effect and whether or not past cases are to be regularised on the basis of these orders. It is clarified that these orders take effect from the date of issue of Board's letter referred to, except (i) in the case of staff for whom similar orders had already been issued by this office and (2) categories of staff whose initial seniority lists have yet to be framed.
