

Serial No. 1537.—Circular No. 447-E/O(Eiv), dated 10-4-1962.

Sub.—Reimbursement of legal expenses to Railway servant involved in prosecutions and subsequently acquitted.

A copy of Railway Board's letter No. E(G)60LL1-27, dated 12/13-3-1962 is reproduced below for information and necessary action.

"It is observed that cases in connection with the above are referred to the Board's Office unduly delayed. Attention is invited to this office circular letter of even number dated 9-1-1961. The Board desire that necessary instructions may again be issued that the staff concerned should file their claims for re-imbursement immediately after they have been acquitted by the Court and that all such cases should be referred to the Board within a maximum period of six months."

The Board's letter dated 9-1-1961 referred to above was circulated vide this office letter No. 447-E/O(Eiv), dated 1-3-1961.

Sub.—Liberalisation of Leave Rules on the recommendation of the Central Pay Commission.

A copy of Railway Board's letter No. E(S)62CPC/LE, dated 22-2-1962 is reproduced below for information and guidance.

"Reference Railway Board's letter No. E(S)I-60CPC/LE/6, dated 13-7-1960 on the above subject. In modification thereof the President is pleased to decide that the production of the certificate prescribed in it will not be necessary, when ;

- (i) a Railway servant has continuously officiated in a Gazetted post for more than three years and has not availed of any leave ;
- (ii) a Gazetted Railway servant has availed of earned leave for which certificate under rule 2022 (bb) (i) as substituted, vide Advance correction slip No. 70-RII forwarded under Board's letter No. F(E)60/IC-1/2, dated 14-2-1961 has been furnished to the Accounts Officer and he has been allowed increment without its being postponed.
- (iii) a Gazetted Railway servant has officiated in a higher post for which certificate of continued officiation in the lower post but for appointment to the higher post has been furnished to the Accounts Office and the Officer has been allowed to count the period for increment in the lower post."
