**Sub.—Grant of TA for journeys undertaken for medical examination in category CI to the candidates who applied for Appendix III-A Examination from Inspector's Group.**

The Railway Board consider that when a candidate of Appendix III-A examination goes for medical examination to enable him to appear for this obligatory departmental examination, he may be paid travelling allowance for the to and fro journey only. No daily allowance for halt on the journey need be paid to him under rule 307-R.I.

**Sub.—Recommendations of Jagannadha Das Pay Commission—Revision of the rates of grant of Travelling allowance for journeys on tour beyond a radius of 8 kilometres from the headquarters.**

*A copy of Railway Board's letter No. PC-60/TA-2/1, dated 4-5-1962 is reproduced below for information and necessary action:—*

**“Sub.—As above.**

It has been represented to the Board that the revised travelling allowance rules as introduced in Board's letter No. PC-60/TA-2/1, dated 22-5-1961 consequent on the recommendations of the Jagannadha Das Pay Commission should be made applicable to the staff governed by ex. Company travelling allowance rules. The Board have considered the matter and have decided that the staff governed by ex. Company travelling allowance rules may be given an option either to be governed by the existing travelling allowance rules or to come over to the revised travelling allowance rules and rates as introduced vide Board's letter of 22-5-1961 referred to above. Staff may be given two months' time within which they could exercise the option and the option so exercised shall be final.

This has the sanction of the President.”

The Railway Board's letter dated 22-5-1961 referred to therein was circulated under this office letter No. 39-E/O-V(Eiv), dated 6-6-1961. It should be noted that the staff governed by ex. Company travelling allowance rules have the option to come over to the revised T.A. Rules within the periods of 2 months from the date of issue of Railway Board's letter viz. 4-5-1962. These orders should, therefore, be given wide publicity to enable the staff to exercise their option within the stipulated time.

**Serial No. 1591.—Circular No. 803-E/315-II(Eiv), dated 25-5-1962.**

**Sub.—Seniority of temporary grainshop staff on absorption in other Departments.**

Reference para. 1 (iii) of this office letter No. 803-E/315-II(Eiv), dated 19-1-1962. It has now been decided by the Board that the temporary staff who were recruited for a regular Deptt. prior to 15-9-1945 but initially posted to the Grainshop Deptt: and on release were absorbed in categories different from those for which they were originally recruited, should also be allowed to count their seniority in the absorbing Department from the date of their appointment in the Grainshop Department.

2. The Board have further desired that the following procedure should be followed in readjusting the seniority of concerned staff:—

(i) The seniority of grainshop staff vis-a-vis others should be readjusted with effect from 7-4-1962.

(ii) Promotion of staff already made to higher grades (selection or non-selection) prior to date of issue of these orders, if any, on the basis of seniority previously determined should not be disturbed. They may, however, be reverted, if necessary, on the basis of their revised seniority only on account of contraction of cadre (entailing reduction of posts) provided it is not due to the expiry of a temporary post created after 7-4-1962 for less than six months duration. The staff who may now be due promotion to higher grades on the basis of revised seniority should be promoted against future vacancies only.

(iii) Such of the staff who have been confirmed against posts on the basis of the seniority previously determined should not be reconfirmed, their seniority, if necessary may be revised in accordance with the above orders. Those who may become eligible for confirmation on the basis of revised seniority should be confirmed against next available vacancies.

3. The seniority of those recruited after 15-9-1945 for regular Departments but initially appointed to grainshop Deptt: shall on absorption in other Deptt: be regulated by the orders already issued in this office letter referred to above.

**Sub.—Advance from the State Railway Provident Fund.**

According to the instructions issued in this office letter No. 11-E/O(Eiv), dated 17-4-1953, certificates from Railway Medical Officers and Registered Medical Practitioners only should be accepted for the purpose of grant of advance from S.R.P. Fund under Rule 1321 (g) II-RI, to meet expenses incidental to severe illness of the subscriber or any member of his family etc. as mentioned in that Rule.
