Sub.—Question whether a Government servant continues in Government service during terminal leave.

A copy of Railway Board's letter No. F(E)64-LE-2/1, dated 18-11-1964 is forwarded for information and guidance.

The Board's letter No. F(E)51/LE-2/5, dated 6-9-1954 referred to therein was circulated under this office letter No. 433-E/O (Eiv), dated 18-10-1954.

Sub.—Question whether a Government servant continues in Govt. service during terminal leave.

A question has been raised whether a temporary Railway servant granted terminal leave in terms of Board's letter No. F(E)51/LE-2/5, dated 6-9-1954 as amended from time to time, continues to be in Government service, during the period of such leave.

2. It has now been decided that a temporary Railway servant continues in service during that part of terminal leave only which runs concurrently with the notice period and ceases to be in Government service on the expiry of the notice period, the leave to the extent it goes beyond the notice period being treated as a terminal benefit only.

3. These orders which have the sanction of the President, will take effect from the date of issue and past cases already decided otherwise need not be re-opened.

Sub.—Recruitment for Class IV staff in Catering Department.

It has been represented that while making regular recruitment to Class IV posts in the Catering Department at stations and in Dining Cars run by the Railway Administration, preference should be given to the staff already working in the Catering Department on daily wages or on commission basis. The question has been duly considered and it has been decided that in view of their experience in the Catering Department, while filling up regular vacancies in Catering Department, persons working on daily wages or on commission basis should be treated as on par with casual labour, substitutes and temporary workmen vide Board's Letter No. E(NG)58RC1/61, dated 30-1-1961 (Circulated vide this office printed serial No. 1100) as amended from time to time. This is further subject to the applicants complying with the qualifying conditions, age limit and physical fitness standards, etc, as prescribed for such recruitment.
