

Copy of Railway Board's letter No. E(NG)65SR6-31, dated 29-1-1966, addressed to all Indian Railways, etc.

Sub.—As above.

Reference Board's letter of even number dated 30-9-1965 on the above subject. It is further clarified that Inter-Railway or Inter-Divisional transfers on Personal request should not be allowed in such intermediate grades where there is no element of direct recruitment, all posts in such grades being filled entirely by promotions of staff in the lower grade (s).

Chapter III

Rule 12.—Add the following as *Note 2* below this para and existing *Note* be renumbered as *Note 1*.

“The expression “relevant grade” applies to grades where there is an element of direct recruitment. Transfer on request from railway employees working in such grades may be accepted provided they fulfil the educational qualifications laid down for direct recruitment. No such transfers should be allowed in the intermediate grades in which all the posts are filled entirely by promotion of staff from the lower grade (s) and there is no element of direct recruitment.”

Sub.—Correction to the Indian Railway Establishment Code, Volume-I.

In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution, the President is pleased to direct that Rule 1302 (8) of the Indian Railway Establishment Code, Volume I be amended as in the Advance Correction Slip No. 221-RI enclosed.

This amendment will take effect from 10-3-1964.

Advance Correction Slip No. 221-RI

Rule 1302 (8)-RI (as last amended by Advance Correction Slip No. 215-RI)

Substitute the following for the portion "if he has held.....under the proviso to (i) above" appearing at the beginning of clause (ii) of this rule :—

"if he has drawn at any time during the one year immediately preceding the date of quitting service, an element of pay not covered by (i) above whether in his substantive post as per clause (i) or by virtue of holding some other post (s)".

Sub.—Recognition of Technical and Professional qualifications.

In pursuance of the general principles laid down by the Board of Assessment for Technical and Professional Qualifications, the Government of India have decided to recognise provisionally a pass in the final examination held by the State Board of Technical Education, Uttar Pradesh, for two years Technicians Courses in (i) Civil Engineering (Civil Construction Technology), (ii) Mechanical Engineering (Machine Tool Technology); and (iii) Electrical Engineering (Electrical Technology) in respect of the students trained at the undermentioned institutions for purposes of recruitment to subordinate posts and services under the Central Government in the appropriate fields :—

(i) Government Polytechnic, Lucknow.

(ii) Nainital Polytechnic, Nainital.

Sub.—Recognition of Technical and Professional Qualifications.

In pursuance of the general principles laid down by the Board of Assessment for Technical and Professional Qualifications, the Government of India have decided to recognise the 3 years Diploma in Leather Chemistry and Technology awarded up to 1961 by the Director of Industries, Punjab, to the students trained at Government Training Institute, Jullundur, for purposes of recruitment to subordinate posts and services under the Central Government in the appropriate field.
